RULES & REGULATIONS EXHIBITS & STOCK

•• All information can be obtained from the Chairperson •• Board of Directors will not be responsible for any lost, stolen, damaged items or injured animals.

- Tickets are issued to exhibitors, entitling exhibitor to admission to the grounds for Sunday only to pick up exhibits and are not transferable.
- All exhibits in competition must be as specified or will not be eligible, and should be placed between 6:00 pm and 8:00 pm Thurs., July 4h or between 8:00 am and 12:00 noon Friday, July 5th in the Agricultural Hall. Judging starts at 1:00 pm on Friday, July 5th, at which NO ONE will be allowed in until judging is finished.
- 3. Only one article per exhibitor will be allowed in ANY class.
- No exhibit will be allowed entry with marks, names or initials on them where the owner may be identified. All prize tickets must be supplied by the Tweed Agricultural Society, tickets from other venues will NOT be accepted.
- Any person exhibiting must be a bona fide maker or grower of all articles exhibited and all livestock shown - juniors included.
- 6. Domestic Science category All baking must be displayed in clear plastic wrap or bags with tags attached. Pies and loaves may be entered in standard size pans or smaller pans for less waste. All lining on muffins must be removed unless otherwise stated. Special instructions per class are in category section.
- Judges are authorized by Directors to discard soiled, defaced work that has been exhibited more than twice previously and award prizes to new work.
- Junior work category Exhibitors can only enter their own age category but are welcome to enter the adult category up to 16 years of age. No entry fee will apply.
- Exhibits must stay on fairgrounds until Sunday, July 7th at noon for display. Prize money can be picked up at the Fair Office Saturday AFTER 2:00 pm.
- 10. In case of bad weather the Society reserves the right to reduce prize money and/or cancel any event. In all sections where there is not competition, only two-thirds of prizes may be paid. Prize money may also be reduced if emergencies arise.
- 11. All competing Livestock Teamsters and all Livestock Handlers are required to be in control of their animals at all times. They will take full responsibility for any damages that may occur while on the grounds. Waivers and valid insurance is mandatory before entering any livestock category. All animals on the grounds must be either placed in pens, tied up or leashed, excluding events.
- Any person interfering with the judges while judging is in progress will forfeit all prize money. No bribes of any denomination will be attempted upon the judges and their duties.
- Livestock classes 6 to 12 20% will be deducted for membership.
- If insufficient herds are available to provide good competitions, breeds can be combined.
- All registered animals must be registered prior to the Fair by forwarding number and entry to the Chairperson.
- All animals are subject to random drug testing. This includes all horse pulls, games, pet show, etc. All animals must have proof of current vaccinations - NO EXCEPTIONS.

- 1. Entry fee is \$12/animal
- 2. A cow/calf pair is one 'animal', if you are going to split the calf that is an additional 'animal'
- 3. Entry fees are to be e-transferred to bogartcattlecompany@gmail.com after June 20, 2024
- 4. ENTRY DUE DATE IS JUNE 28TH 2024
- 5. Cow/calf pairs may be split
- 6. Each exhibitor may enter a MAXIMUM of three entries into a single breed class
- 7. There will be no entry fee for Youth Show (showmanship & conformation) classes
- 8. Classes will be split by breed, in order for a breed class to be utilized there must be at least one class with six entries. (i.e. heifer calves have six entries and yearlings have one entry, breed class will be supported)
- 9. There will be no substitutions or additions after the deadline

OTHER NOTES:

- No bedding will be provided, straw or shavings are recommended.
- There is no hydro access, generators are highly recommended
- Washing facilities are not ideal, if you have the ability to wash at home before the show that is recommended
- Some cattle may be tied outdoors, pop-up tents would be a good idea
- There is limited overnight space for cattle, if you would like to bring cattle on the Friday prior to the event or leave them overnight after the event please reach out to Eric to
- Cattle may be left in the trailer overnight and camping may take place on the fairgrounds. No campfires, no water or hydro access available. Please make arrangements with the organizer for this option.
- We are expecting in excess of 150 head of cattle and over 50 youth to attend this event. We will do our best to adhere to a quick pace through the ring. It is key that you be on time for your class.


